SYDNEY LARGE GROUP 2018

The Large Group represents our society, its structure, organisation, processes and preoccupations in much the same way the small group represents, say, the family. It both represents and becomes a kind of social mind, reflecting contemporary issues and concerns, modes of thinking and acting, along with opportunities for deconstruction-reconstruction, understanding and transformation. Participants (its members) take up roles and positions that have their mirror in the wider world – positions that assume the not-so-readily seen aspirations, values, politics, expectations and assumptions that members implicitly bring. The Large Group reveals the moods and pre-occupations, anxieties, desires and fantasies we find in our daily living in the wider world as we engage in our neighbourhoods, communities and the wider sociopolitical discourse.

Attending to all these currents is not always easy. Becoming aware of their impacts – even as they happen - and seeing how they influence the conduct of our lives and relationships is not always straightforward, and may even require courage. At the same time, taking them seriously rather than dismissing them, brings all into bas relief. This can be scintillating and empower us to engage constructively with each other as people within the contemporary world of which we are a part.

The Large Group is a structured forum which provides the opportunity for thinking, reflecting and dialogue that is not ordinarily available in everyday life. With so much going on in our world, our nation and our local communities, the Large Group becomes an experiential, real-time medium for exploration and learning about the conscious and unconscious forces that influence us in our work, our communities and the wider world.

Who should attend?

The Large Group is open to all who may have an interest in exploring and articulating the harder-to-hear background sounds, voices, movements and emerging themes of our lives. It is open to those who are prepared to be with and think with others and who wish to recognise and engage with the social and political, conscious and unconscious forces within themselves and other participants as they happen and to find ways of applying their findings to their everyday lives, relationships, communities and society.

The Large Group will be conducted by Teresa von Sommaruga Howard.

Teresa has many cultural influences in her personal and professional background. Born in England of a German refugee father and British mother, she immigrated to New Zealand as a child. She is a registered architect, systemic family therapist and has developed expertise conducting median and large groups. Teresa has applied these three disciplines: architecture, systemic practice, and group analysis in larger settings in various contexts around the world. Increasingly Teresa has focussed on the way unrecognised trauma resulting from socio-political upheaval transmitted through generations, reveals itself in the large group. She has written extensively about her work with large groups and co-authored Design through Dialogue: A Guide for Clients and Architects (Wiley, 2010). She is an honorary member of the Institute of Group Analysis (London) and currently an Executive Member and Treasurer of the International Association for Group Psychotherapy and Group Processes (IAGP) and co-editor of their journal Forum.
